Livestreaming

Currently the camera is focused on the sanctuary and there is little chance of you being caught on camera. During Holy Communion there will be a slide on screen so you will not be seen approaching for Holy Communion.

In general, as long as you are aware that we are being livestreamed, it will be presumed that you have consented to be a part of the congregation and being filmed if you happen to be on screen by accident for example.

Readers, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers will be required to give their consent in a more formal way and they will be receiving forms to sign in due course (this week is already covered). Parents will be required to sing for children.

Copyright, Public Performance Rights and other technical and legal details are also matters we have to bear in mind, but that is not something that should concern anyone not operating the system. (And I will be the one who goes to jail!)

Finally, celebrations of funerals/weddings/baptisms are able to use this facility and it can be with the use of a private access code if you only want invited viewers to watch.
